Demonstration/Model Classrooms:

Leigh Sata updated the committee on the Demonstration/Model Classrooms. Leigh and Stephanie O'Brien, Fixtures Consultant, have walked the nominated rooms, narrowing it down to 7 rooms, 5 at Santa Rosa and 2 at Petaluma. The work on the selected rooms will be done in 10 weeks during the summer of 2016 to coordinate efforts with Media Services/Instructional Computing/Information Technology and avoid classroom disruption. Cost and time are the drivers.

Nominated Room Considerations

- Rooms nominated will not require architectural work, due to DSA constraints.
- Best rooms to consider include a clean ceiling grid.
- Replace lights with more energy efficient options.
- Walls may possibly be adapted for a white board or white board paint.

Rooms Discussed

- Analy 740 and 750 – these two rooms would be better to wait until the Master Planning process is complete.
- Analy Village 615 – computer lab and did not lend itself to the demonstration project.
- Bussman – Maker Space, coordinated with Paul Bielen, this could be better launched as a Facilities project.
- Emeritus 1509 – Good size, but a strange shape and hard to see the whiteboard from a few desks. Not the best candidate for the project.
- Emeritus 1588 and 1596 – Wall required to separate the rooms, so not a good candidate. Also, Emeritus is a candidate as an early bond project.
- Garcia 860-880 – Asbestos in tile floor, do not want to touch it. Kitchen is also in there, would trigger much more complicated project.

Before and after pictures of the rooms will be posted on the website. The pictures will be obtained from Stephanie O'Brien.

- Lark 2060 – Candidate for a phased project. No windows. We may be able to make improvements in furniture. Consider this for longer term.
- Lounibous 2320 and 2329 – 2320 has new furniture already. 2320 is a candidate for furniture only. Both rooms need whiteboards.
- Maggini 2701 – Good candidate.
- Maggini 2923 – Not a good candidate, odd shaped room. Recent IT upgrade.
- Newman Hall – 200 person capacity. Project will be upgraded, do not want to tackle on short term summer project.
- Race 4035, 4076 – two rooms may be worked on, smaller rooms.
- K Doyle 243/Petaluma – PDA workshop is in this room.
- Call 693/Petaluma – they need flexible furniture.

Comments:

Is it wise to spend bond money on Emeritus, given that Emeritus will be renovated?

- We have only selected a few rooms and will hope, with the rooms selected, that it will not have to be touched again.
- Emeritus 1509 is not a typical room and is used for wardrobe during the summer for Summer Repertory Theater. Emeritus 1509 selection will be replaced.

Is the Race Building a wise choice to renovate during the summer due to Nursing?

- Any work done will be coordinated with Nursing.

Doesn't Race have a lot of problems?

- Steve Kwok, architect from QKA, added that the finishes are in good shape and the building is sound. It is a blank slate with a small investment to get to a baseline, making Race a good choice.

She will go through the process of Facilities Planning, Cultural, Technology and Built Environment. Wil Baty will share what he learned on his sabbatical study looking at colleges with big budgets, pedagogical learning and multi-use of labs. • The other two workshop subjects are Sustainability and a general update of the bond activity.
